In 1954 a Juke box (pictured) was installed in the narthex entry area at a cost of \$1,100 (that's over \$13,000 in today's dollars). With the church doors open, the "Select Your Own Music" label encouraged any passerby to pick from 100 songs to play free of charge. The recordings ranged from Bach chorales to old gospel hymns and people with "overwhelming problems found an atmosphere of balm," according to our history. It was deemed a good investment.

This month, we give God thanks for those before us who stepped out in faith to share God's love in a new way. We also project our path forward as our St. James Vision Task Force helps us to define what it means to be "In the City for Good" today. Join us on Sunday, July 20 as our Oregon Synod Bishop Laurie Larson Caesar steps into our pulpit to thank us. Then our July 27 Anniversary Sunday and Meal will feature invited guests, a commissioning of our new Visitation Team, special music, and a generous gift to Lutheran World Relief. We have just begun to attune our ears to new ministries ahead. Maybe you can hear it calling us from the old Juke box.

Anniversary Task Forces



Jazz Vespers at St. James: Sunday, July 20 at 4:50pm with Dmitri Matheny, flugelhorn

Celebrated for his warm tone, soaring lyricism and masterful technique, American musician Dmitri Matheny has been lauded as "one of the most emotionally expressive improvisers of his generation" (International Review of Music). Matheny's discography lists over 120 albums on which he appears as a composer, arranger, producer, annotator or flugelhorn soloist. Matheny presents clinics, lectures, master classes and workshops at leading universities and conservatories, and is gratified to have staged more than 500 free, curriculum-based concerts for kids, introducing over 50,000 school



children to jazz. Today, Dmitri leads the Dmitri Matheny Group, "an all-star jazz band featuring some of the most accomplished musicians in the western United States" (All About Jazz). Come hear Dmitri and the Mike Horsfall Trio on **Sunday**, **July 20**. Pre-Vespers music starts at **4:50pm**.


St. James Visual Arts Group—MIX Fiber Artist Group




Our Endowment Ministry

At their June 7 meeting, our St. James Endowment Committee approved three requests for funding. They were later approved by the St. James Council on June 24. The financial gifts will benefit Portland Experimental Theatre Ensemble (providing scholarships to BIPOC artists), The Giving Plate (a food bank ministry in Central Oregon) and flood relief for those of the Burns-Paiute Tribe in partnership with our Lutheran Church of the Living Waters in Burns, Oregon. This year we will distribute over \$60,000.


