From the Pastor's Desk...

"Your kingdom come; your will be done..."

Are you heaven-bound?

The American philosopher Dalles Willard authored a book in 1998 titled "The Divine Conspiracy." In it he suggests:



"I am thoroughly convinced that God will let anyone into heaven who, in his considered opinion, can stand it."

Can we stand it? The central message of Jesus' earthly ministry was the Kingdom of God. God is busy among us building a society at odds with what the world offers. This kingdom – this new way of living -- ushers in seeds of compassion, hope, love of our neighbor and care for God's creation. It is counter-cultural as we turn the other cheek. We pray for our enemies. We know our money is to be shared. Our lives are an act of treating all with dignity. We pray for this kingdom.

But what if we don't see value in this new-kingdom way of life? Since God's kingdom will be fully experienced in heaven, if we don't appreciate those attributes here, why would we be comfortable with them in an after-life? Thus Dalles Willard's implied question: will we be able to stand heaven?

This month at St. James five young people will confirm their faith in this new kingdom (October 26). We will offer our volunteer time when 20 committees/groups are represented at our Ministry Fair (October 12). We will begin a four-week emphasis on recognizing our giftedness in Christ (October 12 – November 9). All of it is kingdom-work and a taste of heaven that demands both joy and challenge. Unless, of course...we can't stand it.

September Council Highlights

Treasurer's Report: Year to date income is 66.00% of the annual budget. The month to date balance is at -\$9,085.48, but the year to date balance is still good at \$3,465.61.

Pastor's Report: 45 people attended the "I am the Vine; you are the Branches" adult class in conjunction with First Congregational Church. The St. James Autumn Stewardship Emphasis is "In the City for Good". Dates and weekly themes were shared. Mali Jensen has been hired as the new administrative assistant following the departure of Sarah Cutler.

President's Report: There was continued discussion of the proposal to install five recessed fixtures to replace the existing three exposed bulb lighting that is above the walkway in the back of the nave. The motion passed with a 4-3 vote. A Search Committee will be formed to determine the two permanent positions for Organist and Choir Director or one person for Music Director, and to look for potential applicants.

Committee Reports: Endowment Committee proposal approved.

We've had a wonderful start to the school year at the Child Development Center. We currently have 90 children enrolled in the program, with several more enrolling as we move through the fall. This year, classrooms are

utilizing updated curriculum from Teaching Strategies. The curriculum is a research-based program that helps children meet each milestone in their development through intentional teaching experiences. Teachers introduce activities that promote social-emotional, cognitive, physical, and

language growth. We also partner with families to provide resources and activities to support learning at home. We're looking forward to another year filled with love and learning at the CDC.

Fair Trade Coffee/Chocolate Sunday Time is Running Out - Run In on Oct. 5

When I was up in Washington last week, my son said he is now paying more than \$19 a pound for his favorite coffee. Have you tried the True Fair Trade - Equal Exchange coffee WELCA (Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America) sell on a once monthly basis? We'll be in Pioneer Chapel again on Sunday, October 5, following service, continuing to sell the current inventory at the earlier price. Coffee runs from \$12.50 - \$16 per pound depending upon the grind, size of bag, and regular or decaf.

You'll have the satisfaction of a fine cup of coffee, and knowing you are supporting Fair Trade farmers as they care for their families. It's a good thing. Fair Trade Chocolate bars are still only \$4 per bar.

Hope to see you there. (Sorry – cash or check only. It keeps the cost down.)

In 2004, Nastos graduated from high school and moved to New York City on a scholarship to study jazz at the acclaimed Manhattan School of Music.

At MSM, John studied saxophone and composition and in 2007, John completed the four-year degree program in just three years.

Since returning to Portland, John has performed with the who's who of the Portland scene, including the Mel Brown Septet, the Oregon Symphony, the Portland Opera, the Third Angle New Music Ensemble, 45th Parallel, along with many others. He has recorded with the Chuck Israels Orchestra,

Intervision, Drew Shoals, Obo Addy, Ezra Weiss, Damian Erskine, Chance Hayden, Ben Darwish's Commotion, Tony Glausi, Jessie Marquez, and others. He has toured extensively with Grammy-winning vocalist Dianne Schuur, in addition to Grammy-winning artist Esperanza Spalding.

Alongside of performing, John develops tools for musicians, has authored two books in his ongoing series "The Mechanism": An Improvisation Overview and Pentatonic Patterns, and is on faculty at Portland State University and Mount Hood Community College, maintaining a busy performing, recording, and teaching schedule around the Portland area.




Some who join these gatherings are experienced in contemplative prayer and meditation, but many are very new to it all. All you need is a desire to surrender. Thomas Merton put it this way:

And as soon as we listen to what's going on, things will begin to take shape by themselves."

It's also important to note that caring for one's own soul is not a selfish practice; rather, it is inherently selfless. Join us.


